- Ashwell Village Museum: Visit one of the oldest village museums in the country, housed in this beautiful building, dating from about 1500, which is undergoing extensive repair work this year. Free admission for wristband wearers and children.
- 18 St Mary's Church: Morning service 10:45 till about mid-day. Be inspired by this beautiful fourteenth century church, with the tallest tower in the county. See the graffiti on the wall at the base of the tower, including a drawing of the old St Paul's cathedral from before the Great Fire.
- **Rhubarb & Mustard:** 31 High Street. Enjoy delicious ice cream sundaes at Ashwell's favourite café. Imaginative gifts downstairs; and beauty rooms upstairs, offering a full range of treatments.
- The Village Lock-Up: An overnight prison, last used in the nineteenth century.

 Come and try it out for size. We'll only let you out again if you promise to be good.

- Ashwell United Reformed Church: Built in 1852, decorated in English Art Nouveau style in 1906 and refurbished in 2018. Morning service begins at 10:45. Come and see a display of beautiful quilts made by the quilters of Ashwell. Opens at 12:30.
- Victorian Café: Refreshments served all day in the United Reformed Church Hall. Attractions include a raffle for a beautiful quilt. Draw at 4:00 pm.
- **31 Ashwell Springs:** The seven springs on this site are the source of the river Rhee/Cam. Together with the surrounding ash trees, they give the village its name.
- **Village Cricket Match:** Ashwell Recreation Ground. Ashwell CC v. Hare Street and Hormead CC, from 1:30 pm, a typical English scene. Pavilion refreshments.
- 33 All the Fun of the Fair: Fun Fair on the Rec. Refreshments at the Pavilion Café.
- **The Chapel of Rest:** A little gem of an Arts & Crafts style building, refurbished in 2018. Staff from Neville's of Hitchin will be on site to answer any questions.
- **Sarah's Farm Shop:** Open 10:00 1:00 Sundays for fresh bread, fruit and vegetables plus locally sourced treats and household items.
